For Solid Waste Management Plan, Update 2018-2022

The Boyle County Fiscal Court proposes to adopt the county's Solid Waste Management Plan update per 401KAR 49:011, Section 5. The plan, if approved, will serve as the basis for handling solid waste management issues in Boyle County, Danville, Junction and Perryville, for the years 2018-2022.

The proposed plan is available for public inspection beginning on Wednesday June 21, 2017, at the following locations during normal business hours:

Any person wishing to comment on the plan may do so by providing comments no later than close of business on Friday July 21, 2017, to the Boyle County Fiscal Court at 321 West Main Street Room 111, Danville Kentucky 40422. Any person wishing to be heard must make a written request to the Boyle County Fiscal Court no later than the close of business on Friday June 21, 2017.

A public hearing scheduled on Tuesday July 25, 2017 at 10am to receive public comments on the plan. The hearing held at the Boyle County Courthouse Fiscal Court Room. However if no request for a public hearing has been received by Friday July 21, 2017, the hearing may not be held.

The Governing body will respond to written public comments within 15-fifteen days of the close of the public comment period, and will consider the plan for passage at the August Fiscal Court meeting. The plan, if approved, will be submitted to the Kentucky Energy and Environment Cabinet for review and approval.
