

City of Danville, KY US 127 Corridor Sanitary Sewer Gravity Main Project Estimated Cost \$1.5M

In 2007, City of Danville extended gravity sewer to serve all of Junction City, KY. This allowed for the region to address growth concerns as it related to economic viability and limitations on sanitary sewer capacity overall. In correlation to these previous improvements, the City of Danville's goal to do the same for the US 127 Corridor between Junction City and Danville, KY. Currently, there is no gravity sewer that would be able to serve this region of Boyle County. With lack of gravity sewer, this area is starved of valuable utility assets to promote proper sanitary sewer disposal.

Gravity sewer would allow increased economic development and adherence to regulatory preference of sanitary sewer treatment operations south of Danville. Economic growth, over time, has migrated to the south of Danville, but only to a certain point. Gravity sewer in this area would promote overall economic viability along a busy US 127 traffic corridor and lay ground for job growth and prevalence of much needed housing for the region.
