- Pictured:
- Green Loop western entrance
  - Red/Blue/Orange downhill exits
  - Raised tread construction across meadow



Pictured:

- Raised tread cross-section (drainage, retention, and fill)
- Existing 20-30' landfill cap
- Material is delivered to site and distributed from access points minimizing disruption



Pictured:

- Pump Track "launch pad" for initial momentum into rollers and berms
- Asphalt over crushed stoned base
- Accomodates bikes of all sizes and riders of all skill levels
- Sheds water quickly, rideable shortly after precipitation




- Pictured:
- Green Loop western entrance
  - Advanced & beginners asphalt Pump Tracks
  - Red/Orange/Blue Trail meadow sections return riders to loop from hillside

- Pictured:
- "Drop Zone" in Progressive Skill Area (east side)
  - Anchored steel boxes hold dirt in perfect shape
  - Highly durable and low-maintenance feature
  - Varying heights to challenge riders as skill increases



- "Jump Zone" in progressive skill area (east side)

- Mellow, low-speed features comfortable for beginner to intermediate riders

- Easy return to top of skills area facilitates skill-building sessions

- Pink and Purple trails return riders from hubs to loop (center frame)

- Green Loop eastern entrance

- Sturdy 4x4 bridges allow unencumbered stormwater drainage and minimize erosion
