Highlights from August 2025 City Commission Meetings & Community Updates

The Danville City Commission meets on the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month at 4:30 p.m. in City Hall. Meetings are open to the public and can also be viewed live or recorded at [YouTube.com/@CityofDanvilleKentucky](https://www.youtube.com/@CityofDanvilleKentucky).

- The City of Danville and Danville Police Department recognized the promotions of three officers during a pinning ceremony on August 11. Congratulations to Assistant Chief Chris Matano, Captain Adam Wilson, and Captain Ben Ray.
- After 21 years of dedicated service, Fire Chief Doug Simpson has retired. Interim Chief Mike McCurdy will lead the department until the position is permanently filled. Applications are available at www.danvilleky.org/careers.
- The Commission issued a proclamation recognizing September as National Service Dog Month, at the request of K9 Companions.
- The Commission adopted a resolution honoring John B. Caywood, a Vietnam Veteran, former Boyle County Magistrate, local business owner, and active community servant. Our condolences go to his family and friends, with gratitude for his service and legacy in Danville-Boyle County.
- Danville Police Department received approved for acceptance of two grants: Highway Safety Grant: \$8,500 reimbursable grant through KSP to support traffic enforcement., and a 911 Service Fee Grant: \$65,767 to integrate the CAD system with emergency medical dispatch, improving communication with Boyle County EMS.
- Proposals are currently being reviewed for a future early childhood development center at the Jennie Rogers Community Center location.
- Parks Update: The design of Alum Springs Mountain Bike Park is currently underway with ground-breaking expected in Fall 2025, Proposals for Millennium Park Skate Park improvements are being accepted until October 3rd. Visit www.danvilleky.org for more details.
- Zoning Change: Approved for 447 South 3rd Street, changing from Two-Family Residential (RM2) to Central Business (CB).

Recycle newspaper inserts, catalogs, paperback books, phone books and brochures.




Paper Food Containers & Cartons
