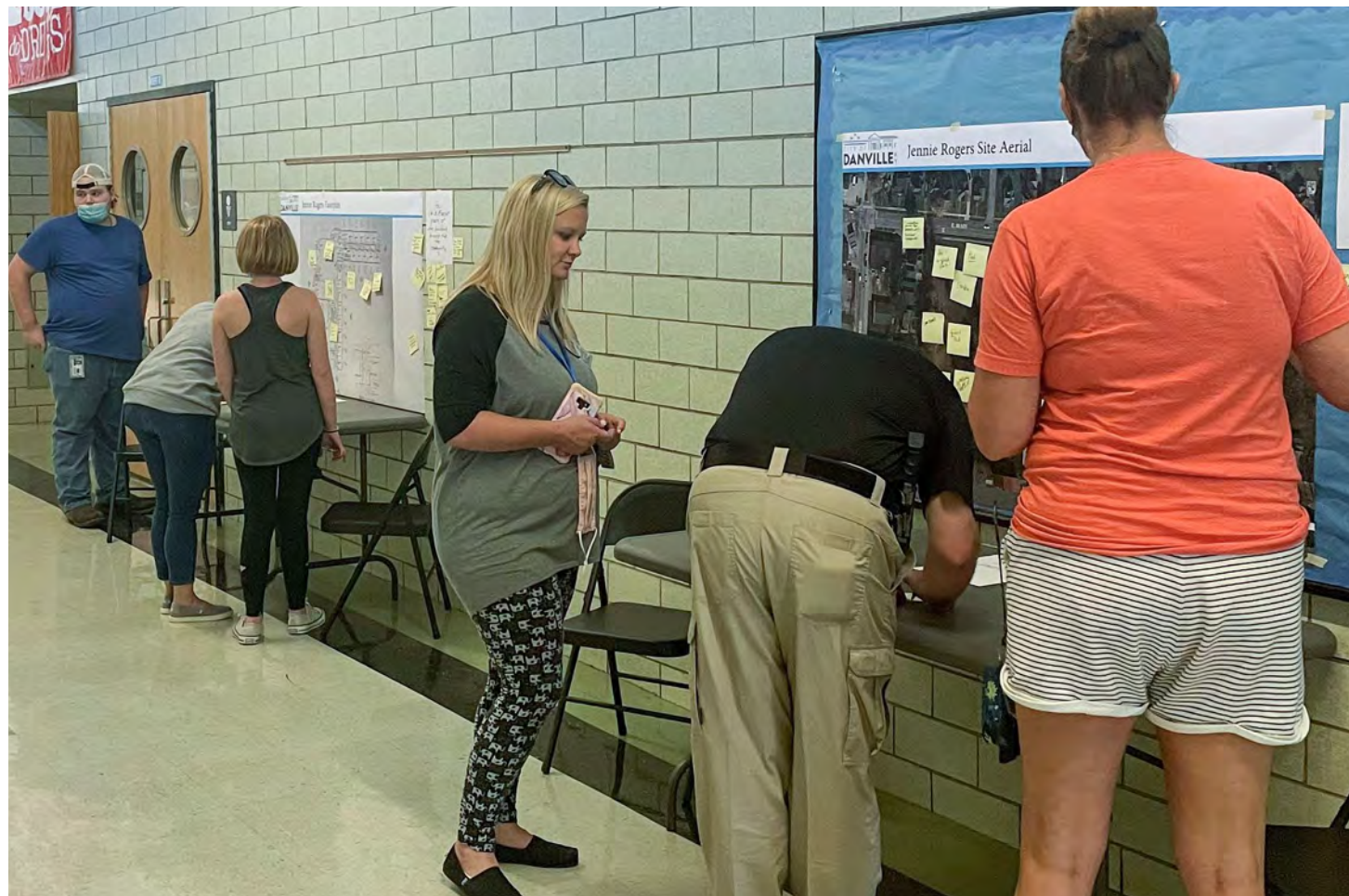
Project Specific Goals & Objectives

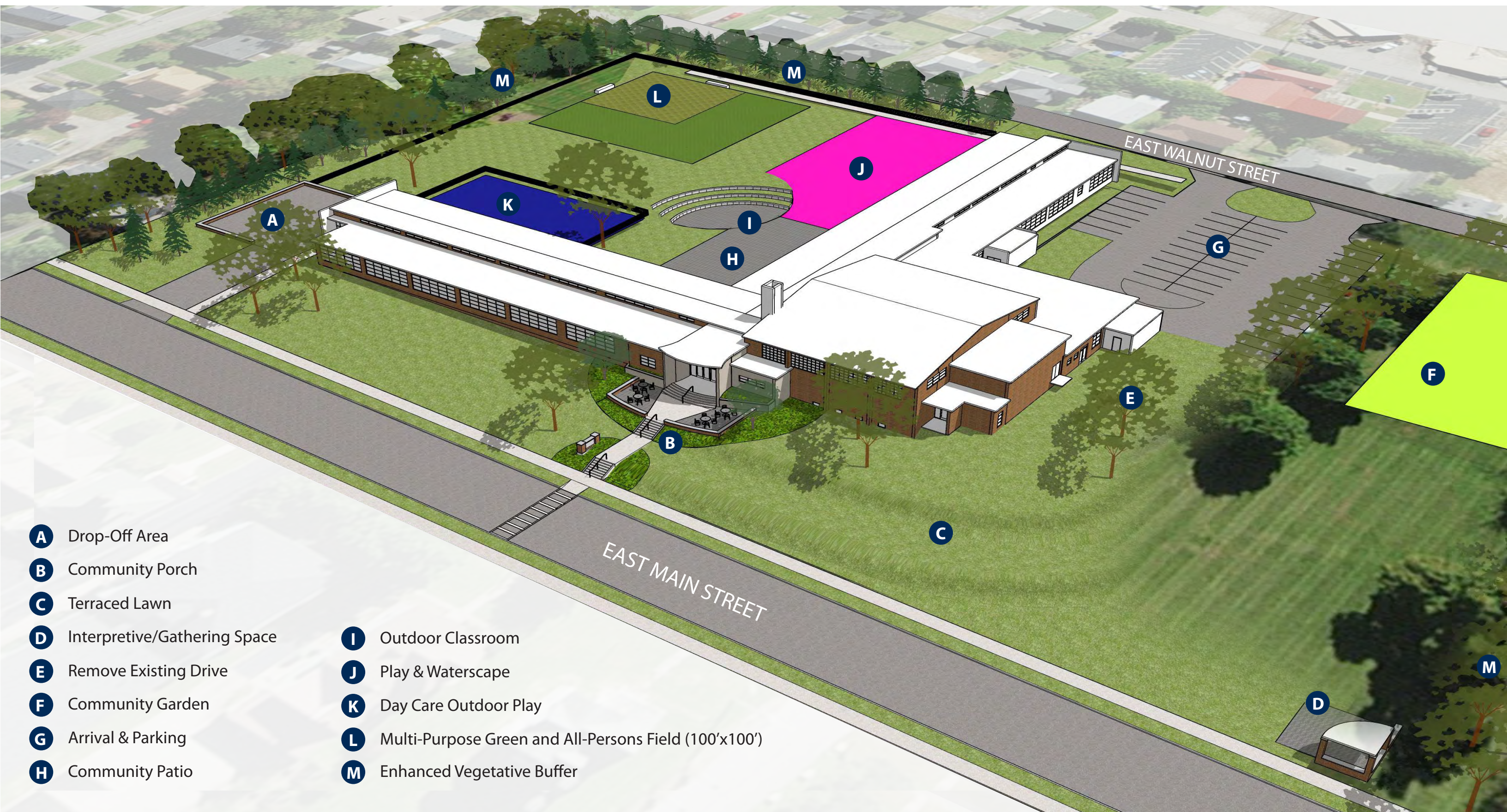

- To **replace and elevate recreational amenities** that are being lost at Bunny Davis, such as pool, tennis courts, racquetball, and multi-purpose rooms
- To **create a unique destination** outdoor aquatic environment
- To **improve and expand** pedestrian and vehicular **circulation** and parking
- To **strengthen neighborhood connections** and buffer adjacent residences

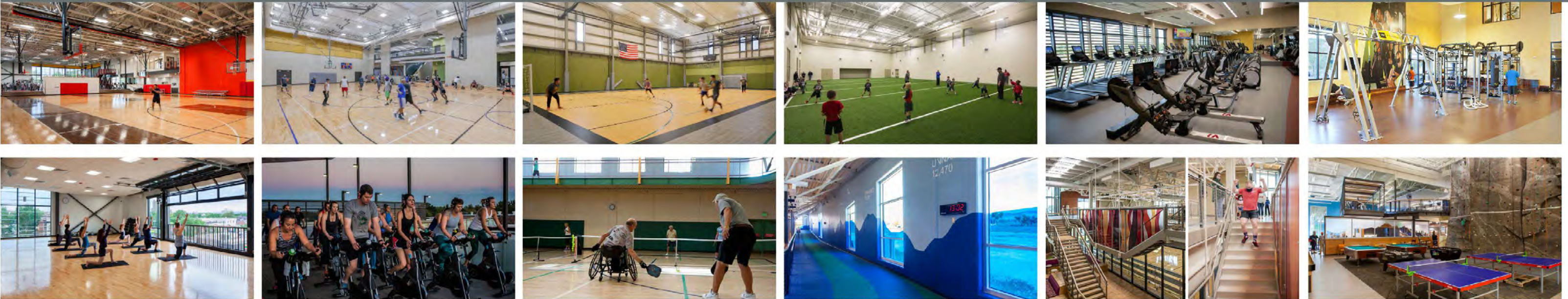

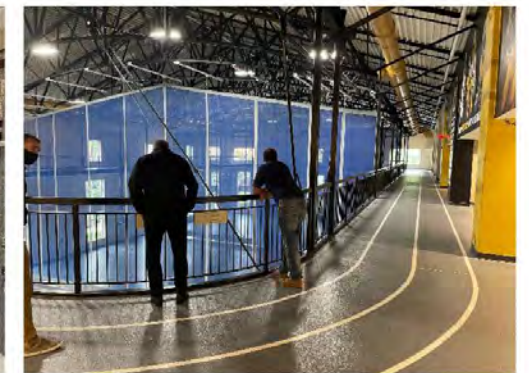
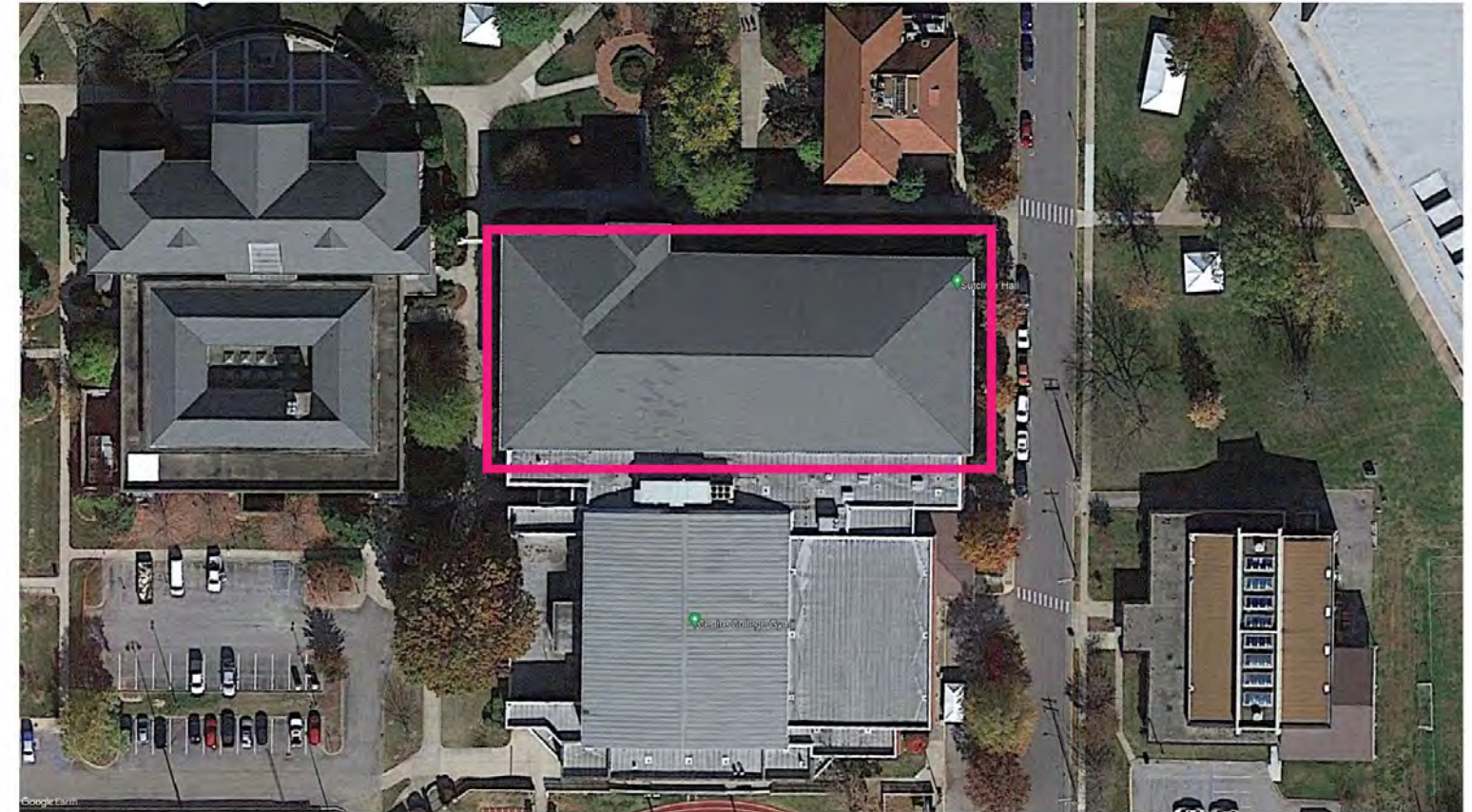


Ziegler Park Pool and Sprayground

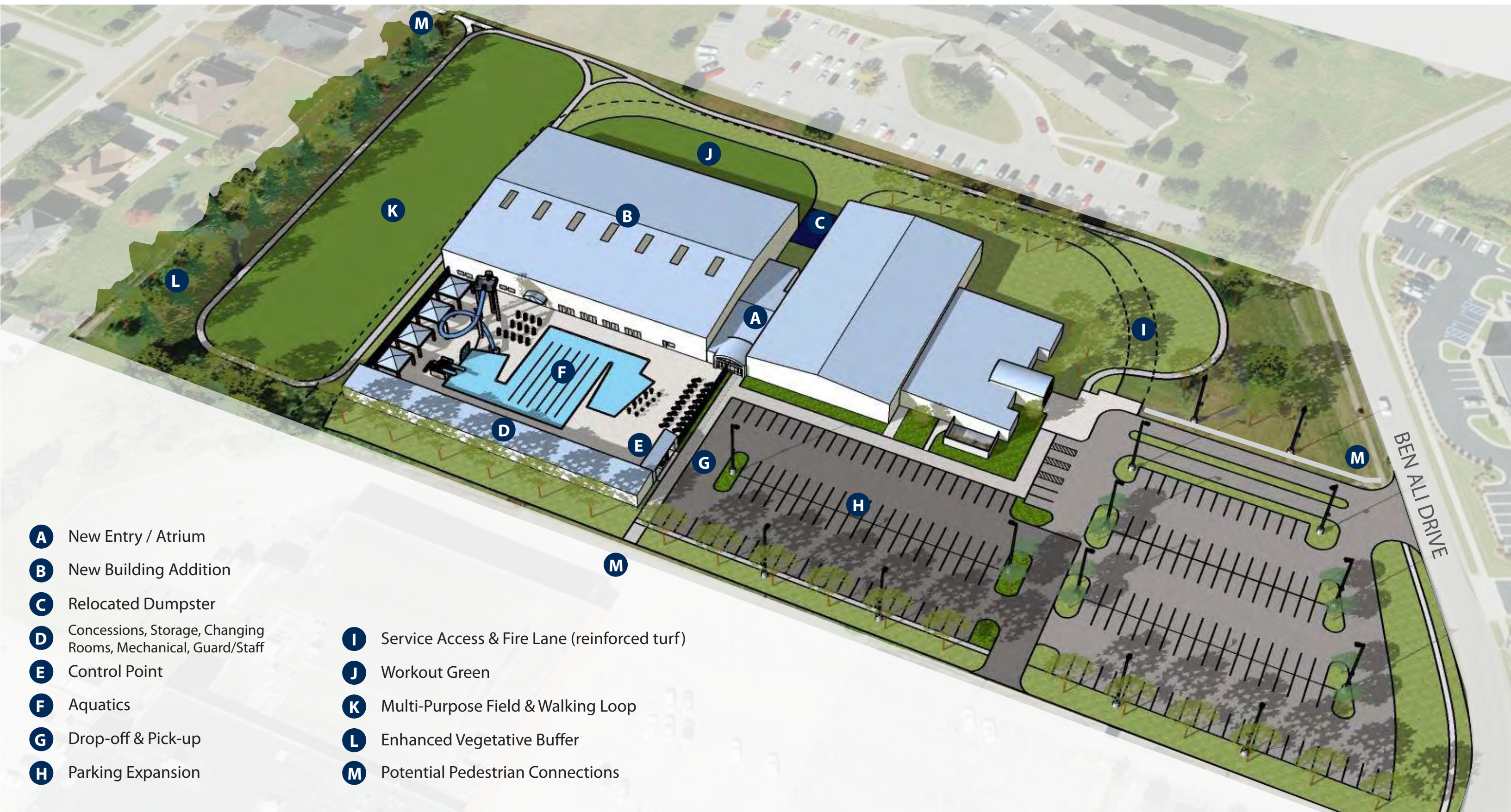

Michael Smith Park

Project Specific Goals & Objectives

- To **update and transform** an existing neighborhood park to **better serve this area of the community**
- To **celebrate Clarks Run stream corridor** as a unique natural and recreational asset
- To **improve connectivity to and from the surrounding community**, connecting to sidewalks and trails nearby, and creating new linkages related to Town Branch and adjacent educational campuses
- To provide improvements that are **durable** and **able to withstand periodic flooding**
- To **celebrate** the history, culture, and people of the neighborhood

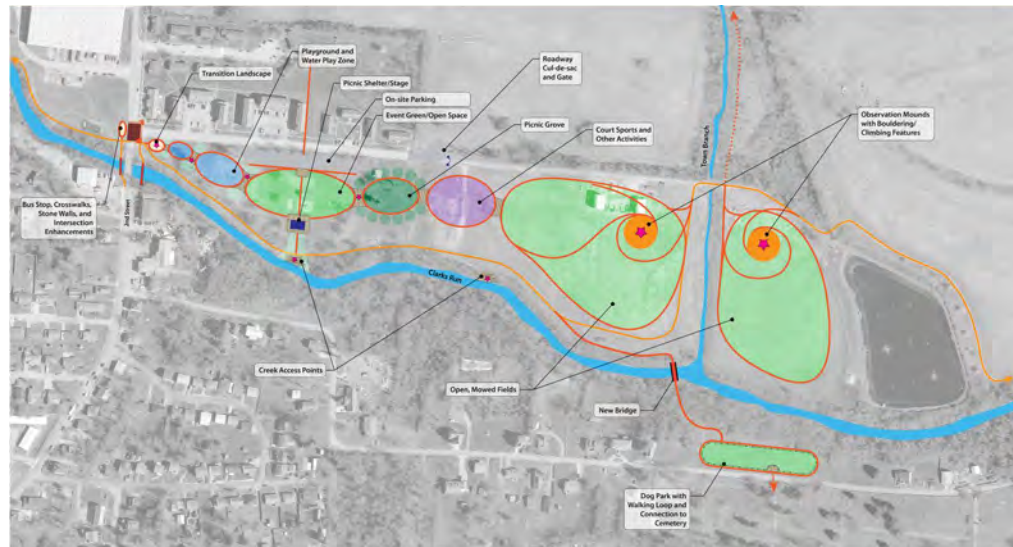
Respondents preferred more traditional park structures with a natural stone and wood palette.

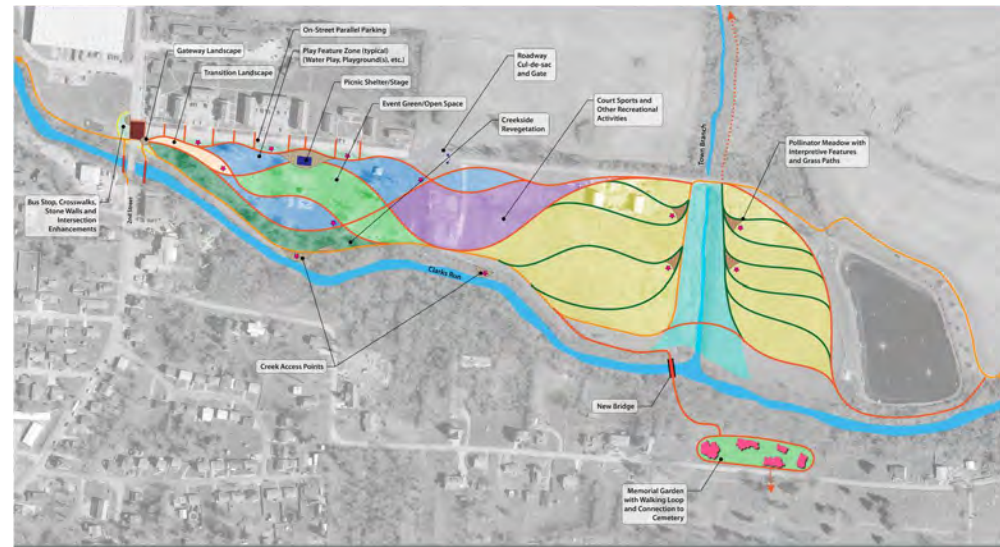

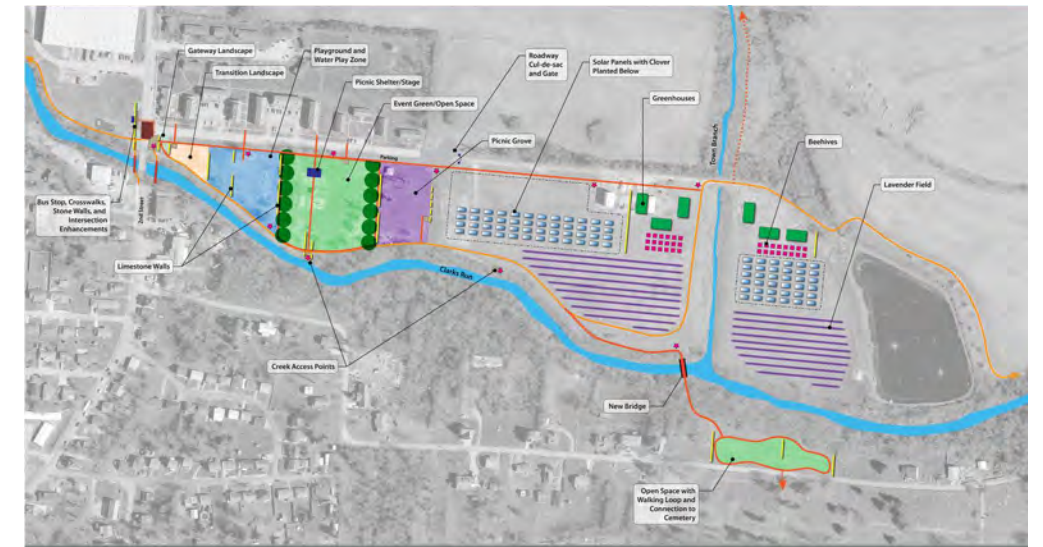
Respondents preferred a well-defined (and even artful) performance/gathering space with a focal point and an open area for the audience.

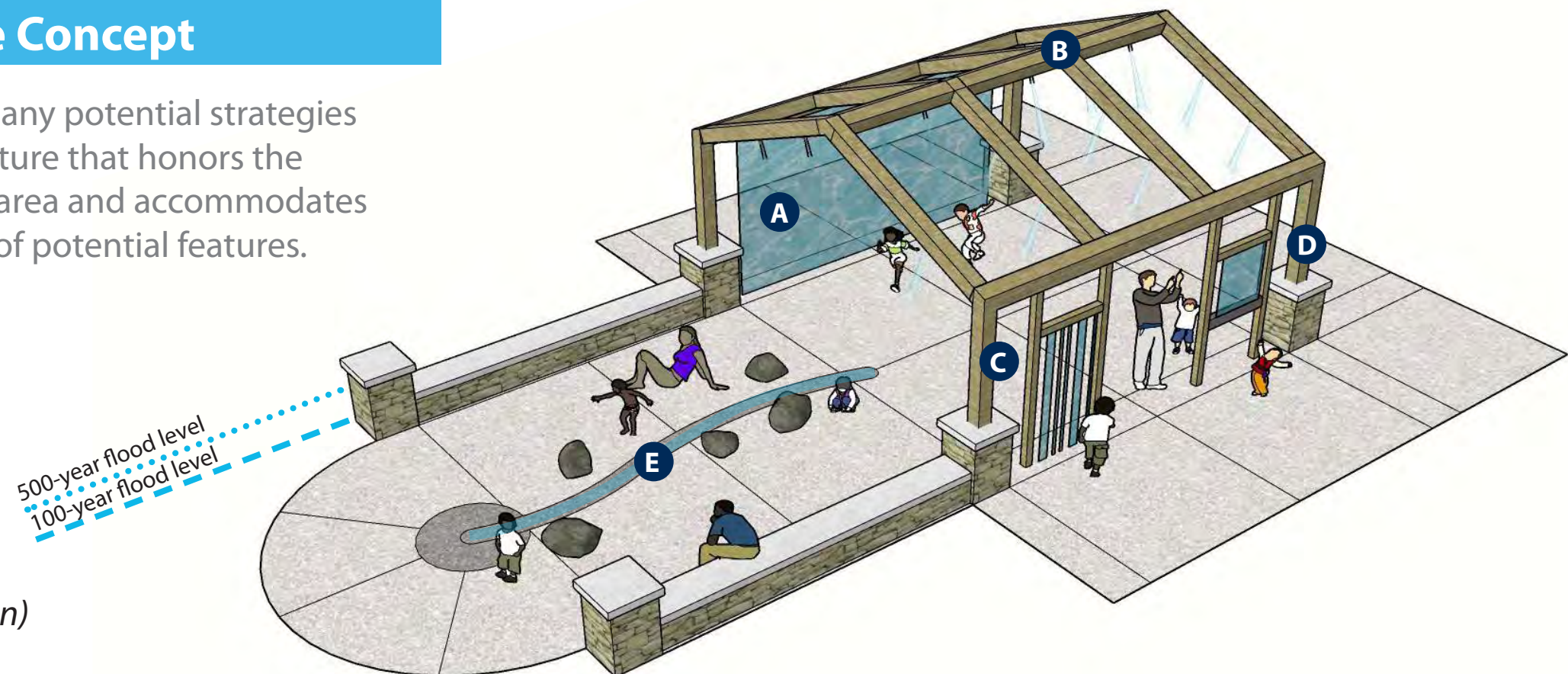

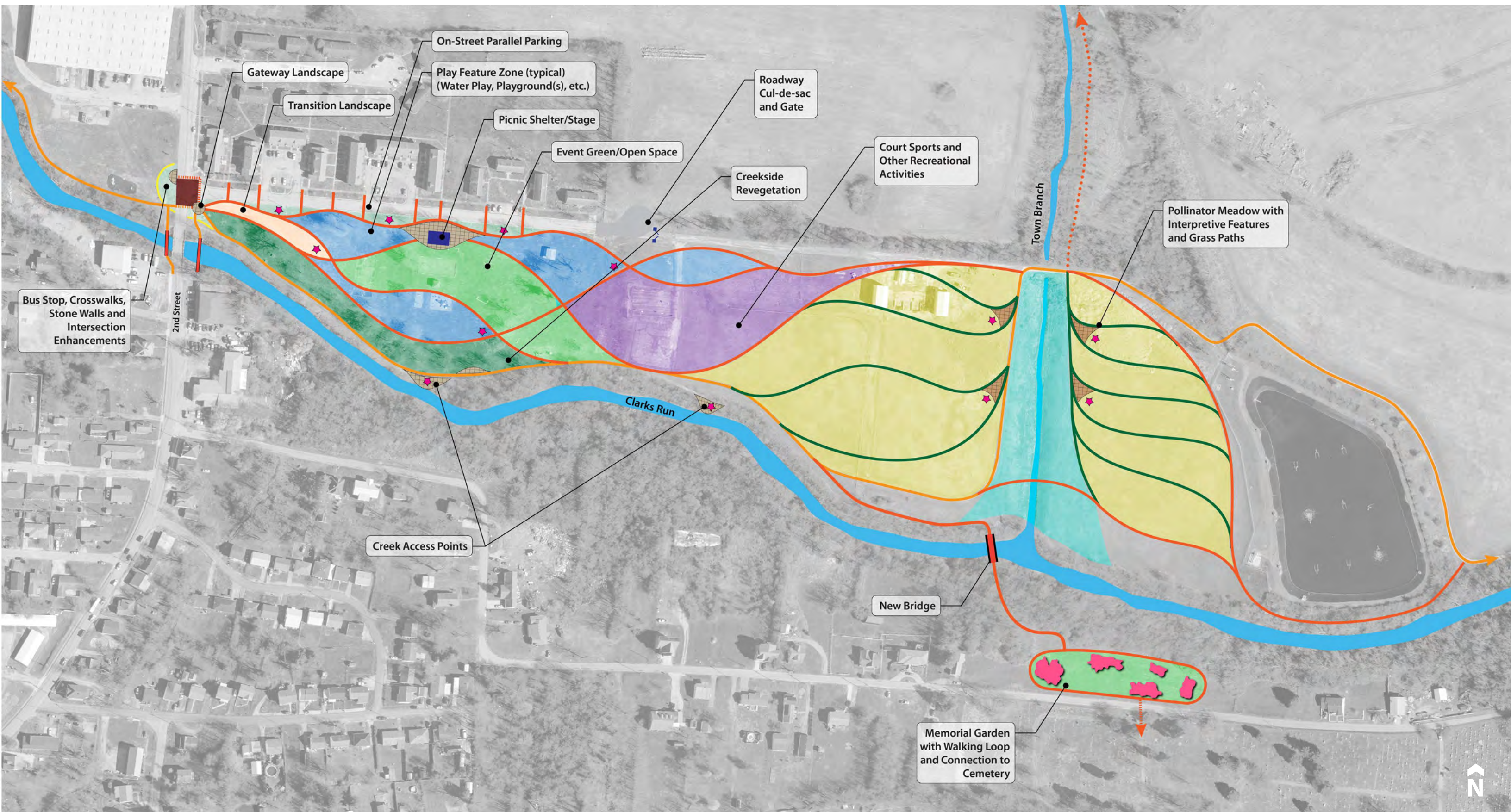

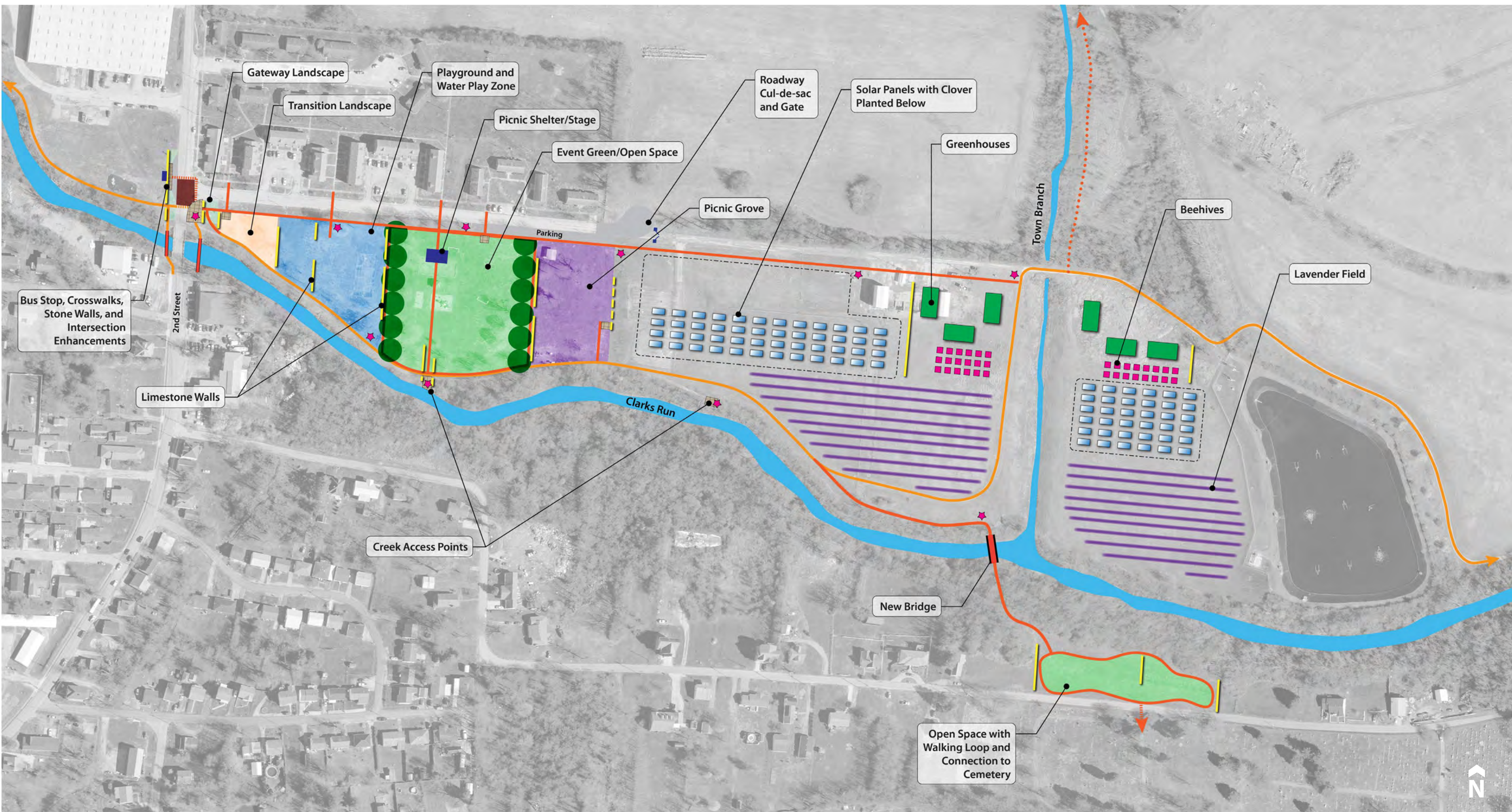

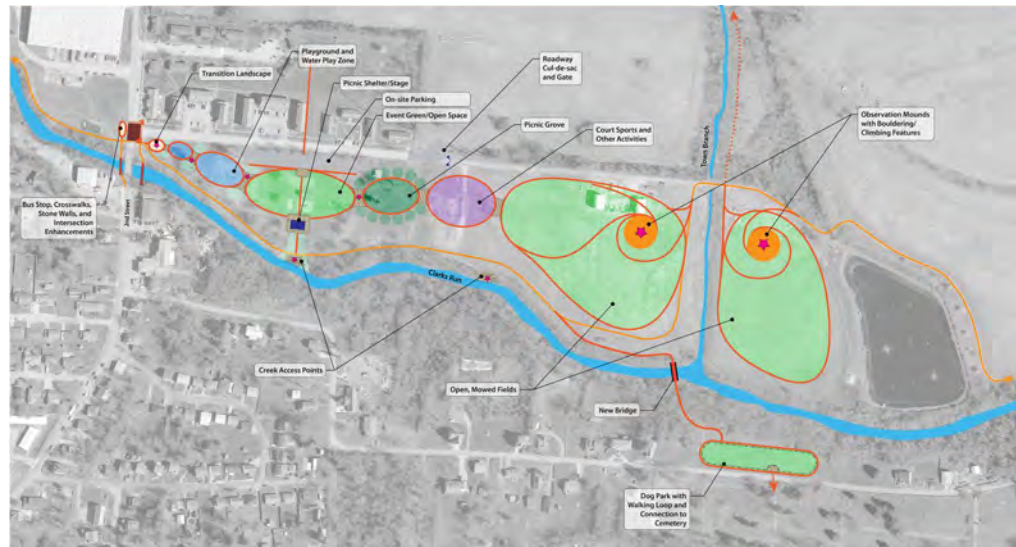

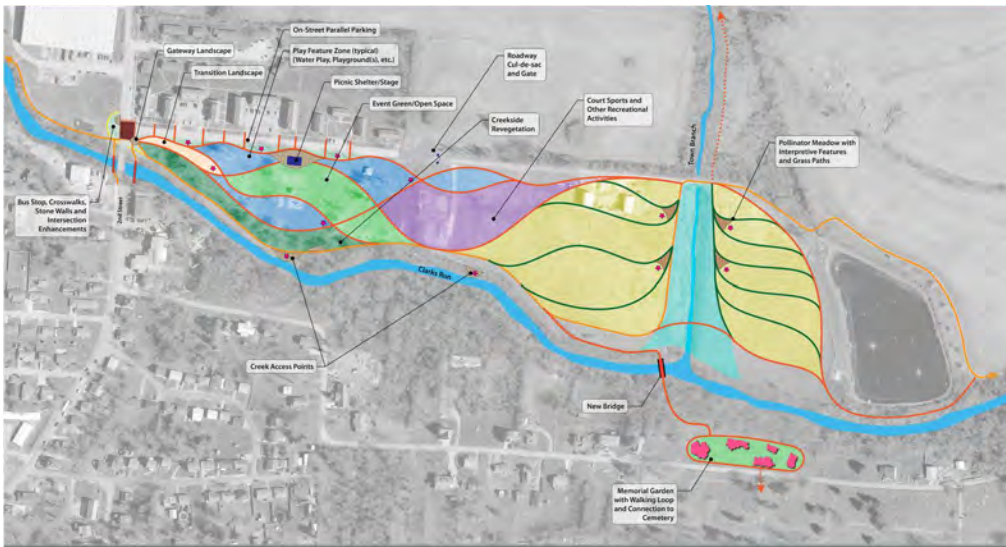

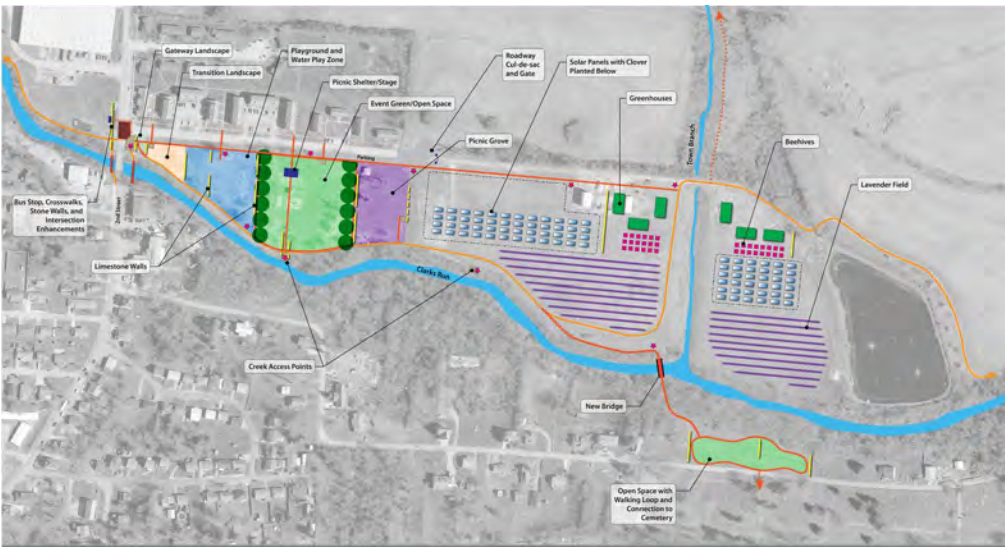

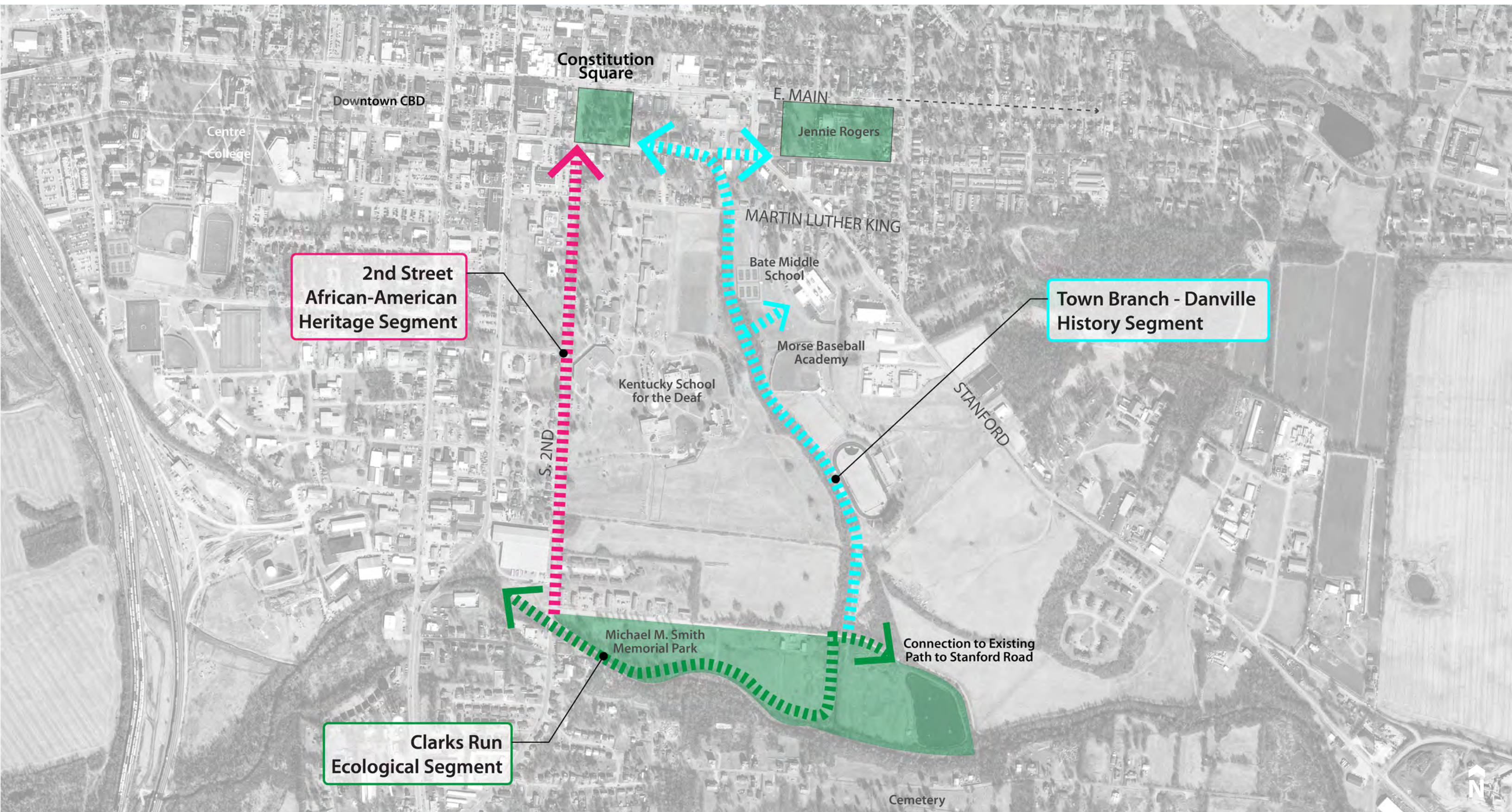

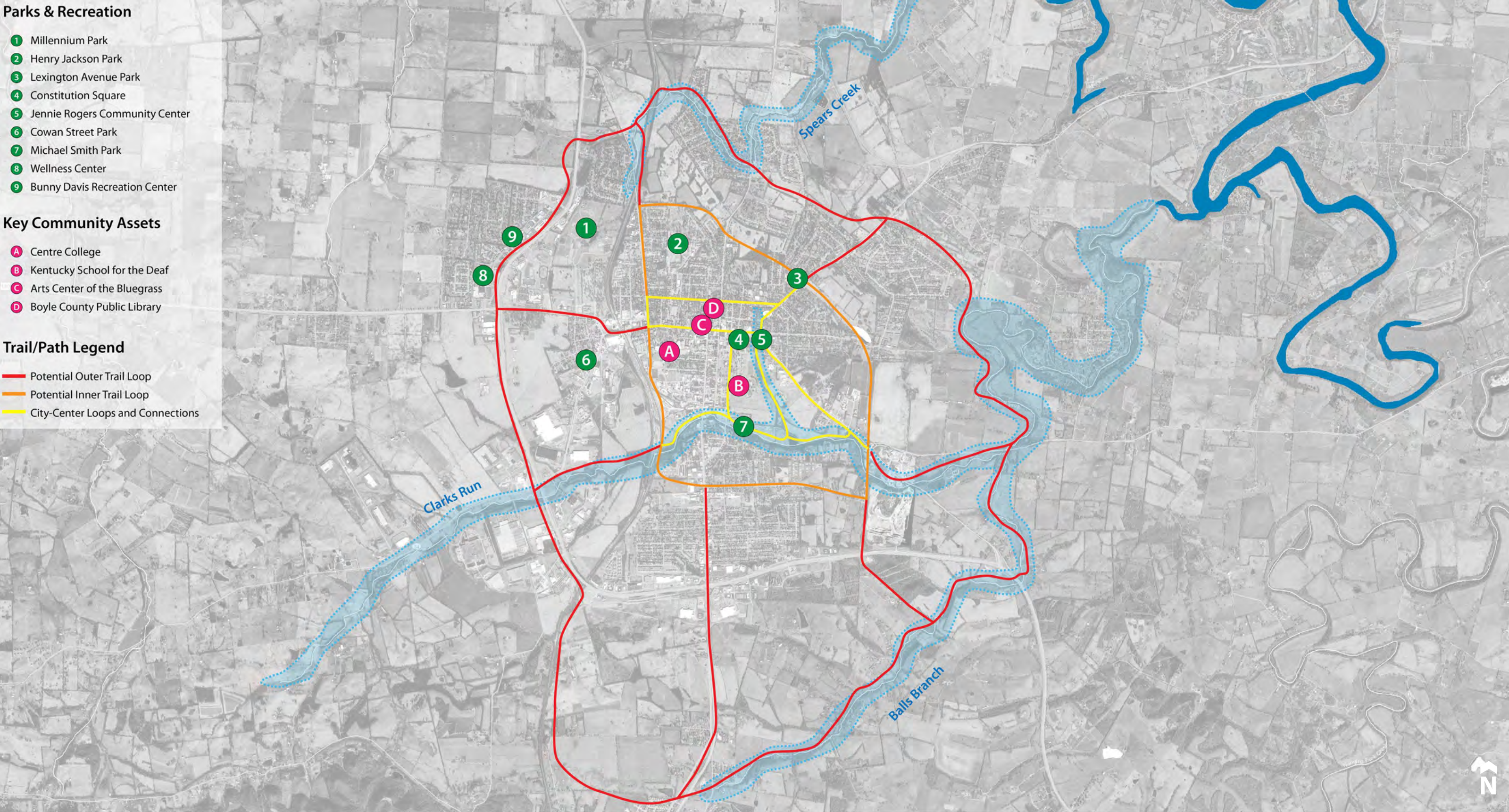

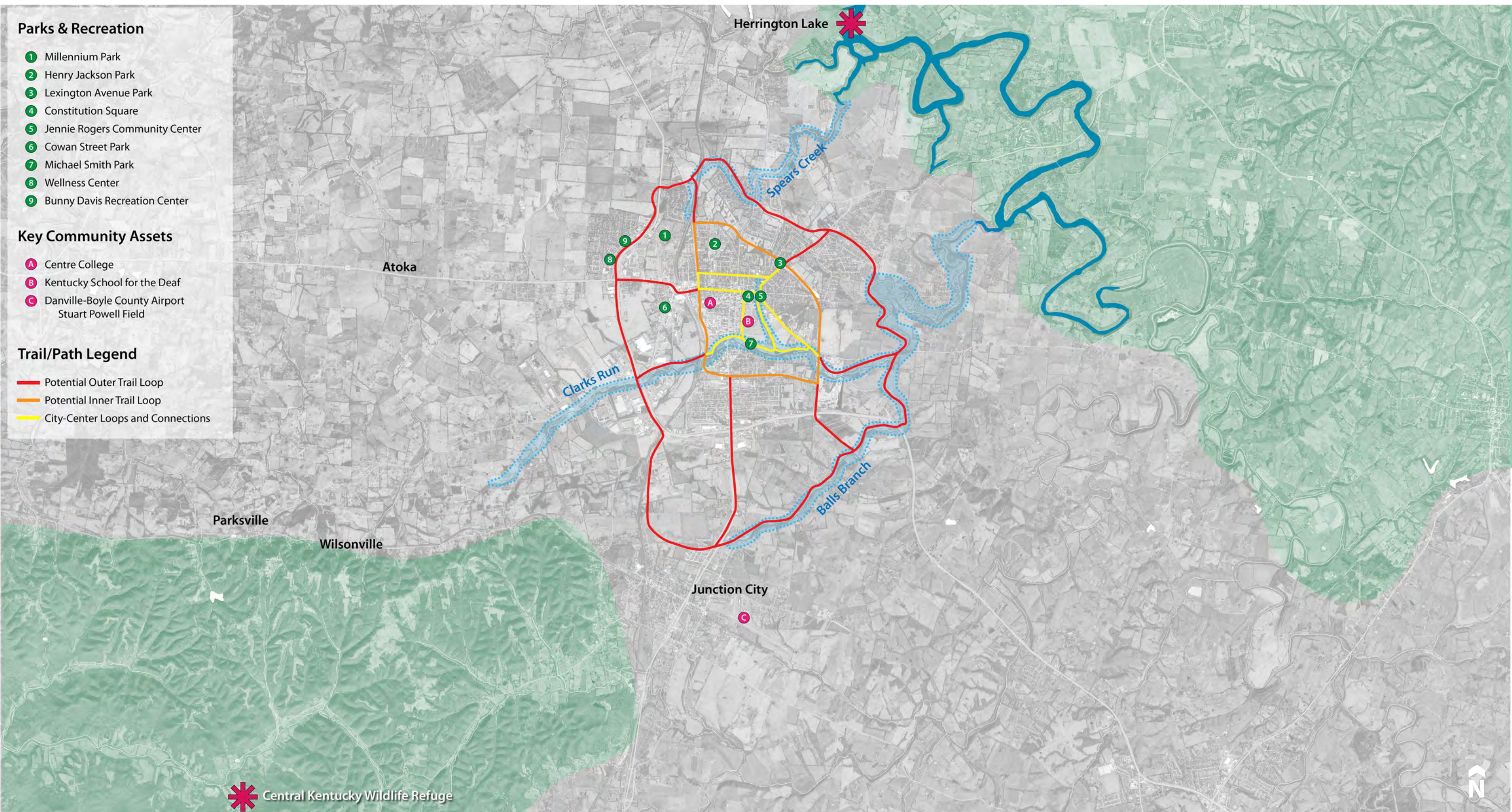
Unity Trail Loop Concept



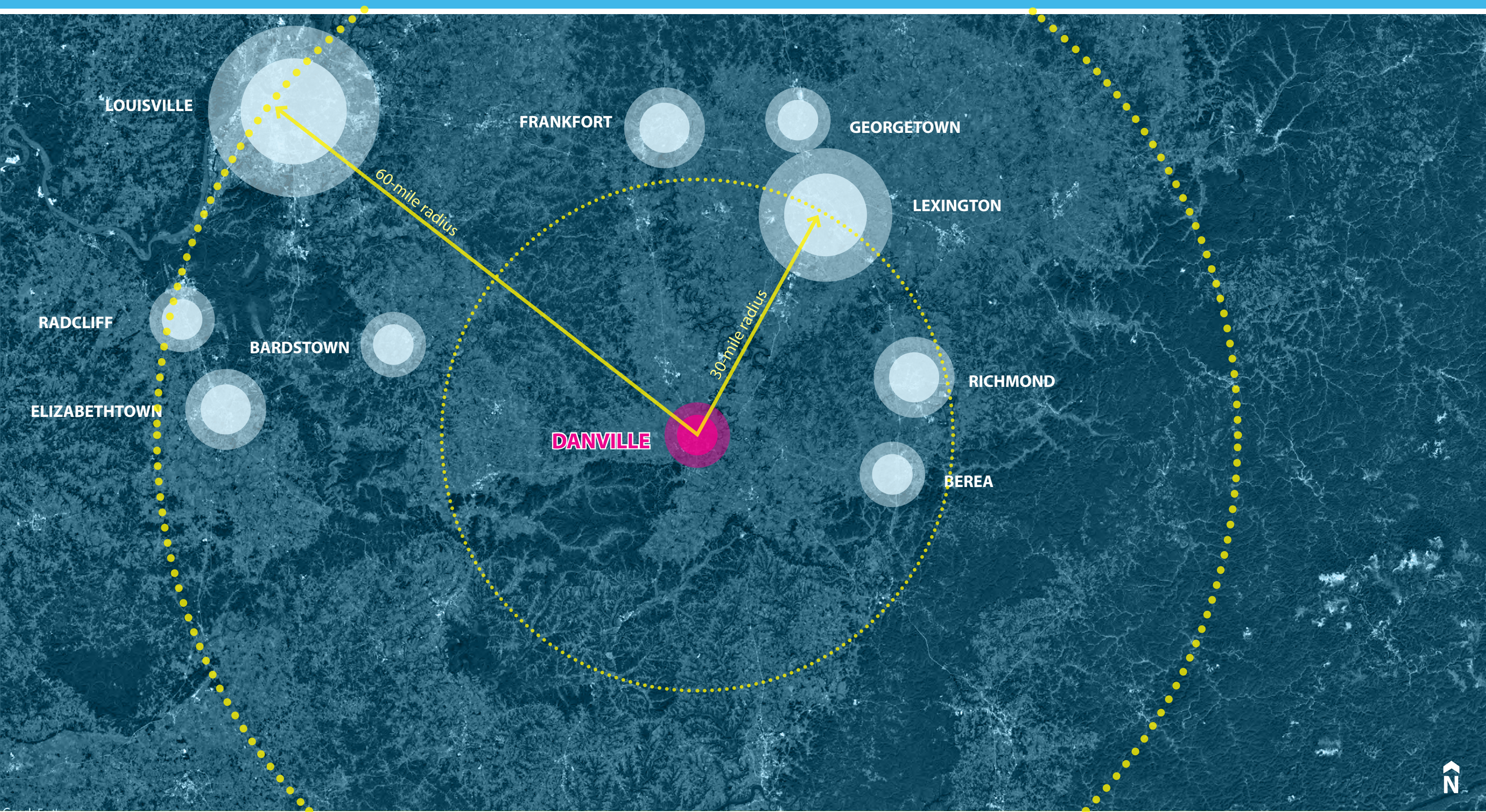
Preliminary Citywide Connectivity Framework

Project Specific Goals & Objectives

- To **meet immediate needs** related to the replacement of tennis courts at Bunny Davis and the Boyle County high school campus, as well as the creation of a new fire and EMS station
- To **accommodate additional recreational amenities** and features that are in high demand in the community as defined in the 2018 Parks Master Plan
- To **improve connectivity** between the Boyle County High School campus, Millennium Park, and the Fairgrounds so that they **function as a more cohesive civic district**
- To **improve the gateway and arrival experience** to/from the bypass
