APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Julie Nelson made a motion to approve the minutes from the October 25, 2018 meeting. The motion was seconded by Allen Knight and the board unanimously approved.

APPEAL OF CITATION # P36592

John W. D. Bowling and Mary Jo Bowling came before the board to appeal a parking citation they received earlier this month on John's truck. John stated that Mary Jo was driving it that day working as volunteer for the City of Danville as a member of the Sister Cities Commission. They was doing an unveiling for the mural that the Sister Cities Commission put on the side of Elmwood Teas. John stated that there are 4 entrances to that lot and the only entrance without a sign is the one from Broadway. Mr. Bowling stated that day there was several people that parked in that lot without a permit. And he stated that he was one of them in a different vehicle. But for some reason Mary Jo was the only one that got a ticket. Mr. Bowling stated that he realizes they was in the wrong but would just like to get the citation dismissed.

Nick Bowden gave the board his testimony from his accounts that day. Nick stated that Bridgette called him to go out there because she had gotten a complaint that the lot was full and there was no parking for tenants that lease spaces in that lot. Nick stated that he wrote 2 tickets in the lot that day. But by the time he got there most everyone had cleared out. Nick stated if there were others in the lot without a permit they would have gotten a ticket too. Roger Hartner also explained in that area there is some spaces that belong to the Beer Engine and other businesses that they do not enforce parking in those spots.

Milton Reigelman spoke on the behalf of the Bowlings and as a representative for the Sister Cities Commission. Julie Nelson wanted to point out the importance of enforcement of permit only

violations. She stated that a lot of employers rent these spaces for employee's so they can park while working and if they show up for work with only 5 minutes or so before shift and can't find a place to park it messes with their business operation.

Antony Gray stated in the spirit of the holiday's, as appreciation for Mrs. Bowling's service to the Sister Cities Commission, knowing that this was not a willful intent to violate any rules or regulations, and knowing that this was a first offense he makes a motion to dismiss the citation. The motion was seconded by Allen Knight and the board approved 3-1.
